## Upcoming Event, December 9, 2016



## Fall Workshop on Oral History

SLRLN hosted their Fall Workshop “Who Tells Your Story: Oral Storytelling” at the University City Public Library on August 29, 2016. Kara Krekeler, reference librarian at the University City Library, and Christa Van Herreweghe, assistant director of the University City Library, presented on the oral history project funded by a grant from StoryCorps, the American Library Association, and the Institute for Museum and Library Services.



Krekeler and Van Herreweghe covered the StoryCorps method, the collaborative nature of the project, and the general how-to of doing an oral history project, from training to recruiting volunteers to doing the actual recording. They gave practical information, including cost-effective ways of setting up our own project, such as inexpensive recording equipment. The presenters also addressed the logistics of setting up equipment to make the participants feel at ease when telling their story. Audience members had the opportunity to use the equipment, which gave a practical understanding of how and what to expect if we did our own project.
