Recap of Summer Workshop

What I Learned at the Magic Kingdom, Webster Groves Public Library

Karen Robinson, Assistant Teaching Professor at the University of Missouri-Columbia, shared what she learned at the Disney Institute. She discussed ways the institute helped her with leadership, employee engagement, and quality service and how each can be applied to libraries. Through group activities, we had



an opportunity to focus on the values of our own libraries and how we can improve our workplaces and service by over-managing (paying close attention to details, not micromanaging) and increasing courtesy and show with our patrons. We also discussed how selecting and training employees is one of the most important things at Disney and should be at our libraries as well. Defining your values and sharing them with employees is very important.

The St Charles City-County Library managers are already acting on what they learned from the workshop and have discussed techniques to use in staff meetings and trainings. The Disney management concept of "we" (instead of "I") was universally endorsed as the best approach to build staff buy-in, especially for new services and initiatives. Managers are documenting how "we" is being observed in the workplace through a shared Google Doc.
